Listening

Intervals

The student will be asked to identify the following intervals: +2, -2, +3, -3, P4, P5,+6, -6, P8 ascending and descending. Candidate's choice: to *name* or *sing* (to "*lah*") the intervals.


The Chords and Cadences

The student will be asked to:

- 1) identify the Tonic chord as major or minor.
- 2) identify chords using funtional chord symbols or root quality chord symbols (candidate's choice)
- 3) identify cadences as: Open-Half, Closed-Plagal, Closed-Authentic or Deceptive

The examiner will play the Tonic chord once, the candidate will identify it as major or minor. The examiner will name the key then play the passage, *twice*. The second time, pausing after each chord giving the student time to name the chords, and the cadence as "V-I Closed-Authentic" for example. Progressions can be found in the BCCM grade 7 technique and studies book.





Listening Grade 7

■ Melody Playback

The student will be asked to play back a melodic phrase for the **right hand only**, involving steps, skips and repeated notes, with a possible jump from tonic to dominant, or reverse, starting on the **tonic**, **dominant** or **upper tonic** note. The melodic range will be within an octave.

The key and time signature will be named, the tonic chord will be played *once* and the passage will be played *twice* with both parts.
