Playing

The student should be prepared to play four chord progressions in keyboard style, each consisting of 8-10 chords. Progressions can be found in the BCCM grade 6 technique and studies book. Memory is not required.

Keys: E^b+, G^b+, G+, G-

Listening

Intervals

The student will be asked to identify the following intervals: **+3, -3, P4, P5, +6, -6, P8** ascending and descending. Candidate's choice: to *name* or *sing* (to "lah") the intervals.

Chords and Cadences

The student will be asked to:

- 1) identify the Tonic chord as major or minor.
- 2) identify cadences as: Open-Half, Closed-Plagal, Closed-Authentic or Deceptive

The examiner will play the Tonic chord *once*, the candidate will identify it as major or minor.

The examiner will play the 5-chord passage *once*, the candidate will identify the cadence as: "V-I Closed-Authentic" for example.

Progressions can be found in the BCCM grade 6 technique and studies book.
